Camille Wiseman has long been interested in our environment. She earned a degree from Texas State University in geography and environmental studies. She also has a background in riparian restoration and agricultural land management, as well as assisting non-profit groups in Central Texas with a focus on conservation.

In her work as a Woodland Ecologist with Texas A&M Forest Service, she advises property owners on a number of issues, one being the Oak Wilt disease that affects the oak trees in the central Texas area.

We are fortunate to have her speaking at our joint meeting with Balcones Country Club about Oak Wilt, which has been identified in our neighborhood. She will address identification, spread, control, and treatment of the disease.

As part of our ongoing efforts to enhance our neighborhood activities, we are considering bringing back or adding a few exciting events.


So far, some people have suggested a Spring Garage Sale and other interesting ideas.

Planetary Parade

The next planetary alignment will take place on January 21, 2025. In the evening, just after sunset, six planets — Mars, Jupiter, Uranus, Neptune, Venus, and Saturn — will align in the sky. Four of these planets (Mars, Jupiter, Venus, and Saturn) will be easily visible to the naked eye. You'll need a telescope or high-powered binoculars to see Neptune and Uranus.

Avian Flu - Arboretum Pond Area

Several deceased ducks have been found at the ponds near the Arboretum office complex. Texas Parks and Wildlife completed testing and found they were positive for Avian Flu. This disease is moving through some wild bird populations as they've migrated south for winter.

The public can assist in interrupting HPAI transmission by limiting all unnecessary contact with wild birds, including not feeding or causing waterfowl to congregate in parks. To help combat this outbreak, it is recommended that all bird feeders and bird baths be taken down as these allow birds to congregate and spread disease easily to each other. Do not handle any sick or dead wildlife or allow any pets to consume
