Tree Delivery

Helpful Hints

<u>Deer</u> - As you plan your decorations remember that we have a few bucks with big antlers running around. Every year there is at least one dragging a string of lights from his antlers.

<u>Placing Trees</u> - Most homes have short PVC pipes buried in front yards near the curb to hold the tree trunks. It is very helpful to sink a 4' green metal fence stake next to the pipe and attach the tree with zip ties around the trunk and fence stake. Also, it foils any Grinches from taking your tree.

Oak Wilt

Oak Wilt has popped up in the Brookwood area. Do you know how to recognize it, treat it, or prevent it? Most of us have little actual experience, but the HOA website is great place to start, because we have knowledgeable people who understand the situation.

What it is - vascular fungal disease affecting oak trees.

How to spot it - generally consists of leaf discoloration, wilt, defoliation, and death.

What to do - contact a certified arborist and Texas A&M Forestry Service.

How do I treat my trees - situations vary so listen to a specialist.

How do I prevent it - read the info on the website about when to trim trees and most importantly, use a certified arborist.

If you think it is a problem for you or you hear about a neighbor with this problem, contact the HOA via the "Contact Us" tab on the website. We are keeping tabs on the situation.

Some of these trees have been around 100 years or more. Let's do our best to keep them healthy.

Old Lampasas Road Dam Project

The City of Austin has begun reconstruction of the small dam located off Old Lampasas Road and across from the PEC substation. It is not visible from the street, but does prevent flooding to several homes, the substation, as well as roads and downstream improvements

- 1984 Dam built of left-over materials from subdivision development.
- 2010 Aware of problems after hurricane and began looking at options.
- 2014 Began coordination of dam design and construction with many stakeholders.
- 2018 Reached 60% design completion.
- 2022 Received Federal permits, 90% design, started COA permitting.
- 2023 Received bids.
- 2024 Started construction 18 months to finish.

<u>Strongly recommend</u> you read the info at both links because there will be lane closures and staging areas on Spicewood Springs Road. Work hours are 7 AM to 7 PM.

City of Austin and Wildlife

Emery Sadkin, the COA Animal Protection Officer for Wildlife, reached out to the HOA to offer his services. If people have questions about wildlife, he can perform yard audits or set out game cameras.

Lower Wastewater Fees

COA does not have a method to determine how much of your water goes into the sewer versus yards and pools. So, they developed a system of measuring water usage during fall and winter months when less water goes to these other uses.

Using the COA link listed below, go to the second button (Wastewater Averaging Calculator), enter your address, and see when your 3-month period begins and ends. The FAQ section should answer most questions.

Plan major laundry, pool refills, and yard watering accordingly.
