- 1-Check the HOA website to see if you are on the list. Paid Trees List HOA Website 2-If you are on the list, then contact us at communications.bvshoa@gmail.com, go to Jason Lee's house, and pick it up. Leave a note on the front porch with your name and address, saying you picked up your tree. 8812 Crest Ridge Circle trees near the curb next to the house.
- 3-If you paid but are not on the list, then email Jacque Forrest, the HOA Treasurer, and she will help sort things out. treasurer.bvshoa@gmail.com

We have 12 trees available for purchase for both HOA members and non-members.

- 1-If you want one, go to the website and purchase a tree or bring a check (\$50 HOA members and \$60 for everyone else).
- 2-Go to Jason Lee's house to pick it up. 8812 Crest Ridge Circle trees near the curb next to the house.
- 3-Leave a note in the box on Jason's front porch saying you got your tree. If paying by check, leave it on the front porch.
- 4-If you paid on the website and trees run out before you get there, please let us know via "Contact Us" on the website, and the payment will be refunded ASAP. https://www.bvshoa.com/

No deliveries - only pick up. First come - first served.

Once the trees are sold out, messages will be posted on the email group, FB group, and the website. Also, trees will be removed from the website store.
